Today we will provide your pet with complete dental care. This includes:

- ◆ Pre-anesthetic blood screening (if not already done in the past 3 months)
- ◆ IV Catheter Placement and Fluid Therapy before, during and after the procedure
- ◆ Pre anesthetic medications and General Anesthesia with full patient monitoring
- ◆ Ultrasonic scaling of all teeth above and below the gumline
- ◆ Motorized polishing of all teeth after cleaning
- ◆ Hospitalization for the remainder of the day for anesthetic recovery and observation

The estimated price for this dentistry package is \$356 for dogs 0-40lbs, \$387 for dogs over 40lbs or \$346 for cats*

When you return for discharge, your pet's technician will provide a full dental record as well as digital before and after images to show the results of your pet's procedure today. She will also explain the recommended aftercare and home maintenance to keep your pet's teeth in top condition.

Dental X-rays

Many pets have a heavy buildup of tartar and calculus on the teeth, hiding teeth from view. These teeth can not be properly and thoroughly evaluated without anesthesia and cleaning. Sometimes damaged, infected or unhealthy teeth are discovered during cleaning. Compromised teeth are painful for the patient and can have serious complications.

The first step in assessing the health of compromised teeth is to take an x-ray. Dental x-rays help us see the tooth root and surrounding bone. Root and bone health help determine if a tooth can be saved or if extraction is required. On average, 1 to 4 x-rays are necessary if compromised teeth are found. The cost of these x-rays is generally between \$50 and \$150.

- I give advance consent for up to 4 x-rays of my pet's teeth today during dentistry if recommended by the doctor.

After taking x-rays, the doctor may determine that a tooth or teeth are too damaged, infected or otherwise compromised to be saved, and must be extracted. Fees for extractions can vary widely depending on the nature and condition of the tooth or teeth involved. We make every effort to save a tooth if possible, but some teeth can not be restored to health.
